

e live in a world which is becoming increasingly polarised. Agreement and consensus are hard to build, and it often seems conflict is permeating our political and cultural discourse to such a degree it is hard to do community well.

Jesus is in the peace business. Peace is a major biblical theme. Jesus promises that those who work to build peace will be blessed (Matthew 5:9). It is often thought that peacekeeping and peacemaking are the same thing, but they are not. Peace is not the absence of conflict. Instead, peace is working through conflict together.

- How do we love people who we a in conflict with?
- · How do we disagree well?
- How do we work toward peace in our local community during a time where we seem to be becoming increasingly divided?
- How do we work for peace on an international level?
- Paul writes that followers of Jesus should seek to live in peace with everyone (Romans 12:17). But how is this possible?
- What do we do if others wrong us?

Do not repay anyone evil for evil. Be careful to do what is right in the eyes of everyone.

Romans 12:17 (NIV)
